INDIGENOUS LAND ACKNOWLEDGMENT

The University of Utah has both historical and contemporary relationships with Indigenous Peoples. Given that the Salt Lake Valley has always been a gathering place for Indigenous Peoples, we acknowledge that this land, which is named for the Ute Tribe, is the traditional and ancestral homelands of the Shoshone, Paiute, Goshute, and Ute Tribes and is a crossroad for Indigenous Peoples. The University of Utah recognizes the enduring relationships between many Indigenous Peoples and their traditional homelands. We are grateful for the territory upon which we gather today; we respect Utah's Indigenous Peoples, the original stewards of this land; and we value the sovereign relationships that exist between tribal governments, state governments, and the federal government. Today, approximately 60,000 American Indian and Alaska Native peoples live in Utah. As a state institution, the University of Utah is committed to serving Native communities throughout Utah in partnership with Native Nations and our Urban Indian communities through research, education, and community outreach activities.

Center for First-Generation Success: First-Generation Scholars

First-Generation Scholars (First-Gen) is an optional college transition and success course within the Center for First-Generation Success for traditional first-year and first-year transfer students who are the first in their family to attend college.

Through this course, students will learn essential academic and college success skills, connect with campus resources, and build community with other first-generation college students. Participants will receive holistic mentoring, advising, and coaching focused on increasing their capacity to solve problems, set goals, and navigate campus and complex life events. Students will also have an opportunity to attend regular events sponsored by the Center for First-Generation Success, including First-Gen Fest and the annual First-Generation Conference (First-Gen Con). These events are open to all students at the University of Utah.

The program defines first-generation as students whose parent (s) or guardian (s) do not possess a bachelor's degree or four-year equivalent degree from a college or university within the United States of America.

TRIO Program

The TRIO Student Support Services Program (SSS) at the University of Utah is an educational success program for first generation, low-income, and students with disabilities who are seeking their first bachelor's degree.

The SSS Program serves qualified admitted students at the university and provides students with academic advising, tutoring, financial aid assistance, career exploration and course offerings in math, writing, and first-year experience (tuition free to those who qualify) as well as disburses \$30,000 of scholarships to participants in the program each year. This program is funded by the U.S. Department of Education, Office of Post-secondary Education.

This unique internship provides undergraduate students from diverse fields and backgrounds the opportunity to learn from and collaborate with the president and other university administrators. This unique experience offers an insider's look into the nuances and complexities of higher education. Through regular seminars and working alongside members of the administration, students learn about and engage in the challenges and opportunities facing the university, as well as American higher education in general. Students gain practical knowledge and skills that enrich their academic and social experiences, while also honing leadership skills and building a professional network. Since its inception in 1992, more than 150 students have participated in the Presidential Internship program. For many, the experience was a catalyst to a career in higher education. Others have gone on to leadership and career opportunities in public administration, nonprofit organizations, business, and civic and public service.



The Presidential Interns help to staff senior administrative offices and work on strategic projects designed to help advance the goals of the university, act as student representatives at various university functions and events, and attend weekly higher education leadership seminars hosted by executive leaders from the campus and larger community. In turn, the university administration benefits from student insight, perspective and collaboration in helping shape the exceptional educational experience at the University of Utah.

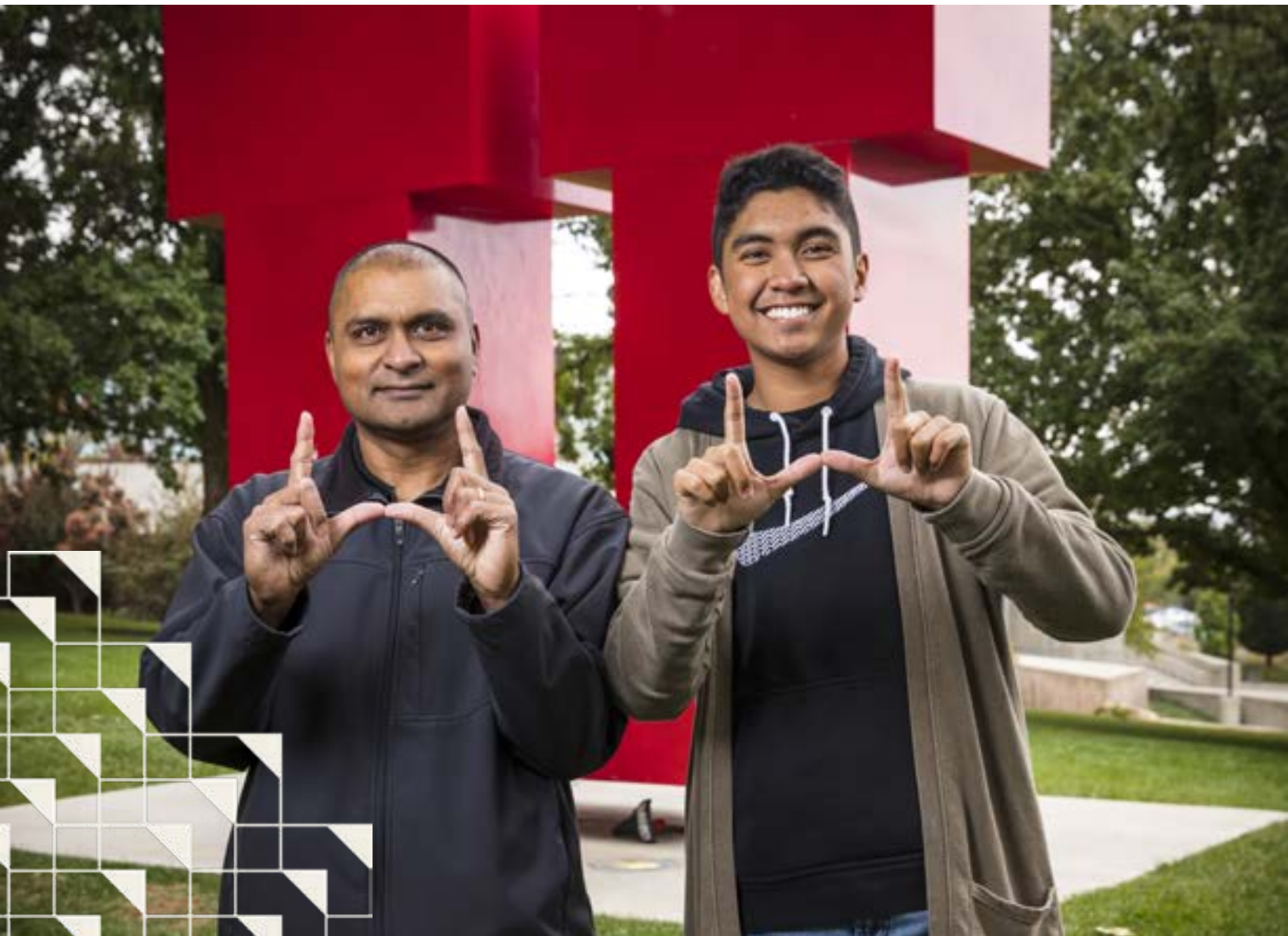

Academic advisors empower students to identify their goals and design the best degree program to meet those goals. Advising is a process, not a one-time event. Encourage your student to meet with an advisor on a regular basis. There are two types of advisors at the University of Utah:

- Navigate Hub for Exploring Students
Advisors help undecided students as they explore majors and minors and support any student as they complete coursework required in preparation for professional health programs and law school.
- Departmental Advisors provide detailed information on major requirements and opportunities within the major.

Advising is always available to students, but there are times when it is required:

- All students are required to meet with an advisor during Utah Bound Orientation and again during their first semester.
- After completing two semesters, undeclared students are required to meet with the Navigate Hub for Exploring Students for further major exploration.
- All students are required to meet with their major advisor to declare their major and to apply for graduation.
- Any student who falls below the required 2.0 cumulative GPA is required to meet with an advisor to devise strategies for success.
